- Actively contribute to gaining client feedback and incorporating client voice into program planning and evaluation
- Engage external professionals to support consultation, planning, monitoring and/or evaluation as required

Program delivery

- Ensure operational delivery of Communities for Children in East Gippsland to meet the deliverables of the program
- Ensure reports, financial adquittals and evaluations are completed in a timely manner and in line with funding requirements
- Ensure data entry into DEX is completed in a timely manner
- Maintain communication with the allocated funder representative
- Maintain relationships, provide support and information and monitor contracts with external Community Partners

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- Facilitate the Communities for Children Advisory Group
- Ensure all program activities are operated in line with relevant legislative and sector standards
- Actively engage in and/or facilitate relevant partnerships, networks and meetings to advocate for vulnerable children and families, facilitate links and engagement between services and families and represent Uniting in a positive manner

Administration and finance

- Track expenditure to budget
- Effectively use computers for word processing, spreadsheets, data entry and promotional materials
